

WINTERIZING YOUR WATER FEATURE

Step #1

Remove UV bulbs from the filters when the temperatures fall below 40 degrees (if applicable).

Step #2

Remove the pump from the pond or water feature when the temperatures fall below 40 degrees.

Step #3

Remove the filters from the skimmer box (if applicable). Hose them off well and then store them in the garage for the winter.

Step #4

If the water feature has an auto fill, disconnect it from the garden hose or irrigation system.

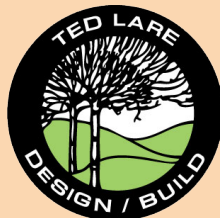
Step #5

If there is fish in the pond, add a pond heater to the pond to maintain open water for oxygen penetration during the winter months. If you do not install a heater the fish will die during the winter months.

Step #6

Place hardy pond plants in the deepest part of the pond. Tropical plants can be stored inside for the winter or thrown away.

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
